JSA Variation Form to be completed if hazard not controlled by this JSA 5. Check condition of roof tiles and access from ground level, If roof frame is not complete including bracing record hazard and advise builder 6. Do not commence task if extreme weather is likely 7. 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2	Check site and tiling job, from inside dwelling	1. Site / building incorrectly or not numbered 2. Aggressive pets 3. Multi unit site (other trades) 4. Fall from height 5. Working alone	H	1. Advise builder to erect correct signage 2. Advise resident that pet is to be secured 3. Liaise with workers to confirm access and safe demarcation distances will be available 4. Fall protection required for 2 storey buildings, If no scaffolding, fall restraint harness to be worn – nationally recognised Safe Working at Heights certificate needed, 2 people required for maintenance on 2 storey dwellings 5. Falls	H	1. Soles of shoes to be cleaned at base of ladder, remove sand, wipe to remove any moisture Use extreme caution moving across roof and frequently check for these hazards as you move across. If any additional hazards are identified , STOP work and prepare / amend the JSA Variation Form 2. Check for any problems such as loose tiles, ridges etc before transferring your weight on to them, Concentrate on task the whole time, do not use mobile phones etc, do not be distracted by a member of the public,	M

7	Check location and count roof tile pallets	1. Pallets in the way of other trades 2. Cuts , splinters	M	1. Arrange immediate collection of pallets 2. Take care around pallets, wear gloves if handling pallets	L
8	Check the site for rubbish piles (separation of timber off cuts)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trips/slips • Falls • Cuts • Sprains/Strains • Impalement 	M	1. Record hazards and advise builder/supervisor 2. Send tiler back to rectify work that is his responsibility immediately	L

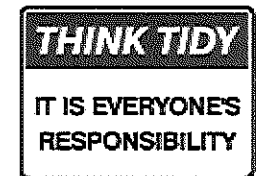
